**COMING UP - 13TH MARCH**

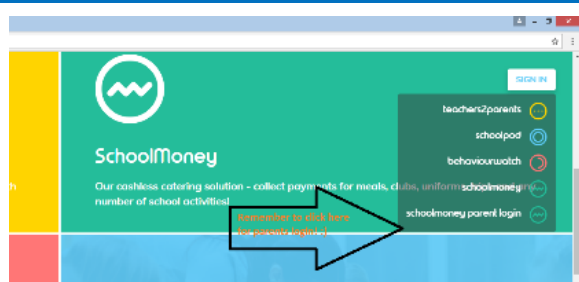

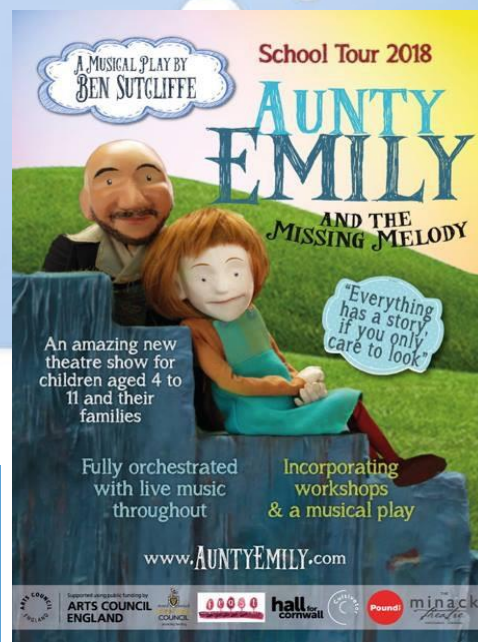
