1. Penwith PE (£4000)

In order to maximise the impact of PE and Sport Premium grant, we have pooled the majority of our funding with eleven other primary schools in the Penwith area to form Penwith PE in collaboration with Mounts Bay Academy. By working collaboratively, we have been able to employ a co-ordinator who liaises with both the Management Group of Head Teachers and the PE Subject Leaders of each school.

Aims

The group was formed in order to:

- To raise the quality of PE delivery across all phases in all schools with a view to raising outcomes
- Offer support with curriculum development, training and support subject co-ordinators in each school
- To increase participation in sport amongst our pupils, including competitive sport and developing opportunities for year 3 and 4 pupils.
- To develop community links with local sports clubs and facilities.
- Support and expand the offer of extra-curricular physical activities.
- To develop bespoke training for the schools
- To increase physical activity and healthy lifestyles

We have benefited from this through...

a) Staff CPD

Penwith PE has provided Newlyn with many opportunities to extend our staff's CPD including...

- An annual review and action plan meeting with the Penwith PE Co-ordinator.

- Free places at Cornwall's PE Conference
- Free places at the Youth Sport Trust's PE Conference
- Year 5 and 6 gymnastics training at Penzance Gym Club
- KS1 and KS2 Real Gym training
- Orienteering training
- Active Maths

Impact and Sustainability

Increased staff confidence and skills with teaching PE evidenced in lesson observations.

b) Surfing

Once again our membership to PPE has allowed us to be able to offer a free surf day to our Year 4, 5, and 6 children. We have also been able to offer a surf club after school for 6 weeks in the summer at a hugely discounted rate.

Impact and Sustainability

The uptake on clubs goes up considerably with this offer as this otherwise very expensive sport becomes more accessible for our children. We are also developing a close link with Global Boarders, a local surf school and directing our children to their discounted Saturday morning club. Following the surf club last year, Global Boarders have approached one of our pupils to ask them to try out for their elite surf training which prepares young people for international surf competitions.

c) Penzance Gymnastics Club

Our Year 5 children will benefit from 6 lessons at our local Gymnastics Club this year through PPE.

Impact and Sustainability

This has provided CPD for our KS1 teachers, up-skilling them when teaching gymnastics back at school. Our membership to PPE will enable us to continue with this offer next year. This link to another local club allows us to signpost families to Penzance Gymnastics.

d) Competitive Sport

Penwith PE created more opportunities for our children to compete in the Local School's Games competitions and further competitive opportunities for all pupils across the schools in inter-school events. Our year 4, 5 and 6 children are currently competing in the Penwith High Five, Cross Country and Rugby Leagues. Our recent association with coaches from the Mousehole football team will mean that we will soon be competing in local football leagues across multiple age ranges.

Impact and Sustainability

Increased uptake of children in clubs and taking part in competitions with some great successes.

2. Go Active – specialist coaches (£1845.50)

To extend the range of after school clubs that we are able to offer, we have invested in specialist sports coaches to teach our children a range of clubs that they requested. These have included:

- Dance
- Dodgeball
- Street surfing
- Multi-sports (skills based games and all round sporting development)

3. Mousehole FC football coaching (£1008)

To extend the range of after school clubs that we are able to offer, we have invested in specialist football coach from Mousehole FC. This coach has in his remit a duty to expand football for young people in west Cornwall and is actively creating opportunities for pupils to train, participate in and watch high quality football. So far this year the football club have taken part in excellent drills and teambuilding exercises and have been given free tickets to watch a premiership team play at Mousehole's ground.

4. Sports Equipment (£875.52)

We have invested a considerable amount of money in re-stocking our PE equipment including the purchasing of balls, bats, nets and posts. This is going to be used in conjunction with the Year 5 sports leaders to create more opportunities for skills based play at break time and even open ended exploration of the outdoors using simple den building equipment.

5. Outdoor learning and forest Schools (£825.74)

We have invested in loose parts equipment to promote active lunchtimes with den building. (see above)

Measuring the Impact of PE and School Sport Premium 2016/17

At Newlyn School, we are committed to improving our PE provision and providing extra-curricular activities that are chosen by our children. Through pupil conferencing, we have started a variety of new clubs that our children have requested which has therefore seen an increase in the percentage of children attending clubs in both KS1 and KS2.

In the first half of Autumn term 2017 we had 85% of pupils in KS1 and KS2 participating in after school clubs. This was an increase on 82% from 2014/15 and on 65% from 2013/14.

Competition

Level 1 (intra-school):

Intra-school competitions have included High Five, Tag Rugby, Football, Rounders and Athletics, as well as our yearly EYFS, KS1 and KS2 School Games Sports Day.

Level 2 (inter-school):

We participate in various competitions as part of the Penwith League, including, High Five, Tag Rugby, Rounders and Cross Country.

Level 3 (County level):

In 2017 Newlyn school was awarded Silver in the School Games mark scheme. While we are proud of this achievement we are currently working with our PPE sports co-ordinator to make sure we achieve Gold next year!

In academic year 2014/15, our Tag Rugby Team won the Penwith League and got through to the County Semi-Finals, finally achieving 4th place out of 25 teams.
