<h3>Perseverance</h3> <p>This means not giving up, even when something is hard or takes a long time to learn or finish. It's about trying again and again until you succeed.</p> <p>How you can show perseverance: Practice New Skills; Finish Tasks - Even when they feel boring or hard, don't quit until it's done; Be Patient it's okay to take time to get better at something.</p>  <p>What will you persevere at?</p>	<h3>Go Welly Wandering</h3> <p>When it's pouring with rain, what could be better than chucking on your wellies and waterproofs and splashing around in the puddles, soaking up all the watery fun? You just need rain, some waterproof clothing, wellies and yourself. You could jump in puddles, squelch in mud, jump over puddles, splash through paths, splish around your garden or splosh around the park.</p> 	<h3>Science</h3> <p>Look in the mirror at your teeth and make observations about what you can see. Are all the teeth the same? What differences can you see in their size, shape and sharpness?</p> <p>Draw a diagram of your teeth and label where the different teeth are.</p> 	<h3>Go on a nature walk at night.</h3> <p>Some creatures only come out at night, so this is your only chance of spotting or hearing them. Going on a nature walk at night means you'll see and hear lots of things that you wouldn't normally notice in the daylight.</p> <p>Here's what you will need:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A grown-up so you're not alone • A torch • Warm clothing and sensible footwear • Your eyes, ears and maybe a camera. 
<h3>Watch a bird</h3> <p>You don't need to go anywhere special to start birdwatching as birds are everywhere. You could start in your back garden or local park. Birds can be shy or timid, so you'll need to be very quiet and try not make any loud noises. You could take photos of the birds or draw a picture. If you need to, ask an adult what type of bird they are.</p>  <p>How many birds will you see?</p>	<h3>Maths</h3> <p>Access maths.co.uk and complete your 'Homework Grid Challenge'</p> 	<h3>Kindness</h3> <p>Kindness is being nice to others, helping them, and showing you care. It's like sharing your toys, saying kind words, or helping someone who feels sad.</p> <p>Record yourself being kind – this can be out and about in the community, at school or at home.</p> 	<h3>Art</h3> <p>In art this term we are learning about Antoni Gaudi. Can you create a mosaic in the style of Gaudi using cut up magazines and scrap paper.</p>
