It was so wonderful to see so many children and adults dressed up to celebrate World Book Day.



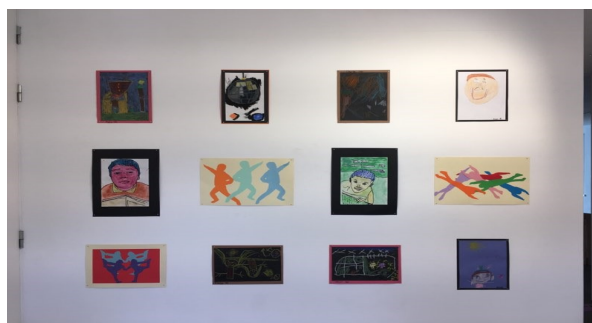
Local Painter Talk
