Covid Guidance:

Children with COVID-19 should not attend school while they are infectious. They should take an LFD test from 5 days after their symptoms started (or the day their test was taken if they did not have symptoms) followed by another one the next day. Being a governor is different to every other experience and so everyone is in the same boat when they start. There is high quality training available free of charge which provides everything that you need to know.

Also, the other governors will come alongside you and help you. You will not be asked to do anything until you feel confident and ready to do so. Everyone supports each other.

FAQs

What does a school parent governor actually do?

In a nutshell, governors monitor the school and make sure that there is a clear plan in place to make the school run efficiently and effectively with a clear vision. They look at whether the educational performance and the staffing structure of the school meet required standards and monitor whether money is spent in the right way. They hold the leadership team to account for this through asking for information about each area of school life and reading relevant reports.

Is it very complicated and difficult?

Governors are not expected to have in depth knowledge of all of these areas. They need to have the ability to read documents, ask questions and spend time talking to staff members and each other. There is a big difference between checking that the teachers have a plan in place for their subject and having to understand every detail of that plan.

I can't be a parent governor; my children don't behave well enough at school!

Being a parent governor has no relation to your children or their performance academically or behaviourally. Your own child's school journey is totally separate to your governor role. The school will not treat you or your child any differently because of the governor position that you hold. It's all about having a team of people who can work together for the good of the whole school and every pupil.

Will I get to hear all of the school news in advance?

Governors are involved in various different decisions but it is important to stress that they do not get involved with the day to day running of the school which is left to the staff. Governors are more involved with broader decisions about school structure and management that impact the school as a whole. You will hear various bits of news before other parents but it is very important that this is kept confidential until the school chooses to share it publicly; this is part of the trust relationship that exists between the governing body and the school.

Will I be a go between from the parents to the school?

Although you will sometimes be asked for your opinion as a parent, you shouldn't become a bridge between parents and the school. Fellow parents should not be bringing their issues with school to you for you to pass on. Any issues that a parent may have should always be taken to the staff of the school directly. Equally it is not a governor's job to relay information back to other parents.

Does it take up loads of time?

The governor role is one that can fit into life with minimal disruption. There are on average four meetings a term (autumn, spring and summer terms) which you would be expected to attend. These can currently be accessed online or in person and aim to last no longer than 1 hour each. In addition to this you will be involved in subject monitoring which means speaking to a member of staff 2 or at most 3 times a year depending on the subject. There are documents to read beforehand but these are e-mailed out well in advance to give you time to look at them before the meeting.

Do you get paid?


No, governors do not get paid however full training is provided completely free of charge.

What benefits does being a governor bring?

It's really interesting hearing about the different subjects and the kind of thing that goes on in the classrooms. You will gain a deeper appreciation of what goes on behind the scenes of school life and the vast range of opportunities available to the pupils at the school.

It will enhance your CV as you develop new skills and learn all about how a primary school operates. You may well discover skills that you never realized you had!

You get to have a say in the broader decision making process and you will get to know some of the staff better too. You get to be part of a team which exists to make sure the school goes in a positive direction and this in turn has a positive impact on your own children.
